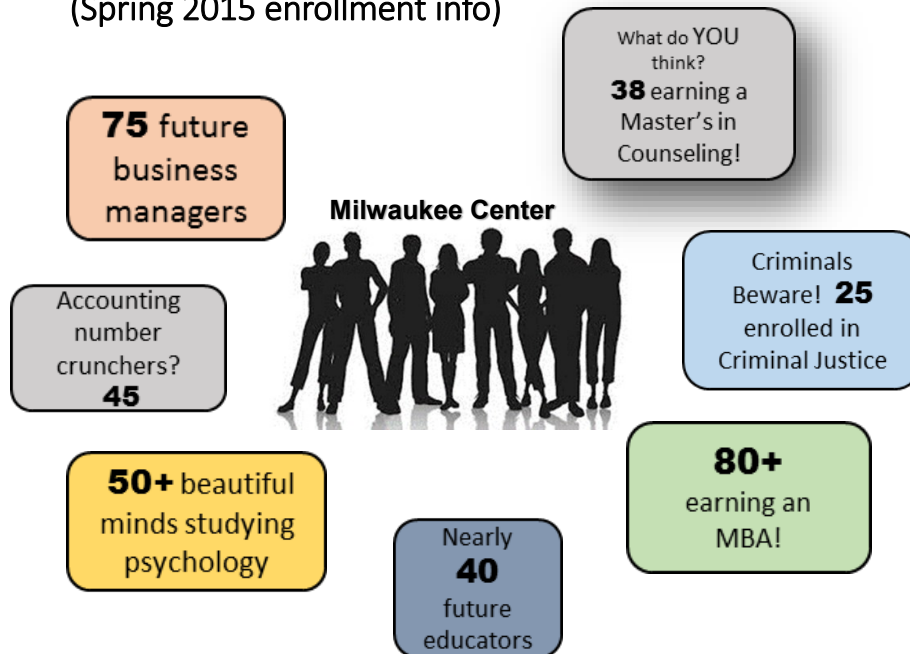

Take Note: Gray Matter Beats High Tech

If you routinely drag your laptop to class and use it to take notes, you may want to rethink your strategy. According to a recent article in the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, taking notes 'old school' could end up providing more bang for your educational buck.

The article refers to a study published last year in *Psychological Science* that was conducted to measure the effects of multitasking in learning environments using two groups of students from an upper level communication course. One group was allowed to use their laptops to engage in "browsing, search, and/or social computing behaviors during the lecture." The other group was not.

"Students in the open laptop condition suffered decrements on traditional measures of memory for lecture content," wrote Helene Hembrooke and Geri Gay, study authors. A second experience replicated the results of the first.

The tutoring was a success. Both students graduated. They continued dating, eventually moved in together and started making future plans. One early morning just a few weeks before their wedding, Jeffrey told his soon-to-be wife that he hoped they could put the family they both hoped for on hold. School, he said, should come first. Earning an undergrad should be a first priority.

At first, Heather admitted, she thought Jeffrey was trying to “push off” having kids. “The conversation caught me off-guard,” she said. “But I totally agreed with him.”

Higher education is emphasized more than ever in today’s world. A high school diploma doesn’t always lead to a career.

“Your degree is the single most powerful thing you have,” Jeffrey said. “It is difficult to get a decent paying job and support yourself, let alone a family, without a college education.”

Since they both knew someone who went to Lakeland, they decided to check it out. They liked what they heard, especially the online courses. And, with Lakeland’s maximum transfer credit policy, neither had to take duplicate classes or start over. It was full speed ahead.

“I was taking three classes,” Jeffrey said, “and a few weeks into our first semester, it was clear Lakeland was the right choice. Tuition was reasonable and the way the courses were laid out set us up for success. The syllabus gives you a week by week breakdown of exactly what is due, when. “Online learning teaches you more about being accountable for yourself and your learning,” Heather said. “Classes were structured to give you guidelines and deadlines, but ultimately, you were responsible for your own success or failure. Heather and Jeffrey will celebrate six years of marriage in September. Both graduated from Lakeland in 2013 with bachelor’s degrees in accounting. Jeffrey is on board to complete his second undergraduate degree – this one in business management. He is thinking about pursuing an MBA with Lakeland.
